NISHTHA 1.0 (ELEMENTARY LEVEL)

1. INTRODUCTION:

Chhattisgarh launched **NISHTHA** training programme on DIKSHA portal on 2nd November, 2020 which concluded on 20th March, 2021 in 8 batches. A total of 1,34,599 Heads and Teachers completed the training from a target group of 1,08,374 Heads and Teachers. Single Point of Contact was identified from the State Resource Group Members for each module and their contact details are sharedwith participants in the course for academic support.

An official telegram group was created by SCERT consisting of members from NRG, SRG and participants so as to disseminate official information and for troubleshooting procedures. Multiple WhatsApp groups were also created for troubleshooting in terms of technical issues and other related problems on the DIKSHA portal.

2. NEED AND SIGNIFICANCE:

As the name suggests, National Initiative for School Heads' and Teachers' Holistic Advancement (NISHTHA) being a capacity building programme for improving quality of education through integrated teacher training, the programme conducted through DIKSHA is believed to be an effective means to improve the same in the state and for the entire country as well.

The courses included are also relevant for continuous professional development for all teachers and school heads and the appropriate for implementation of quality education especially in the $21^{\rm st}$ century. Courses on emerging trends like Covid-19 Scenario Addressing Challenges in School Education, Health and Well-being in Schools are especially helpful information and reliable knowledge forteachers undergoing the course in the absence of physical contact brought about by the pandemic due to Covid – 19.

3. OBJECTIVES:

This capacity building programme for teachers in initiated for "Improving quality of School Education through Teacher Training" which aims to build competencies among all the teachers and school principals. It is the world's largest teachers' training programme of its kind with an objective to motivate and equip teachers to encourage and foster critical thinking in students.

4. SCHEDULE:

Chhattisgarh did not follows the course schedule of NCERT and Chhattisgarh course schedule is attached.

5. MODALITY:

i. Orientation:

Online Orientation programme on NISHTHA was held for programme coordinators and technical administrators on 15th September, 2020 during 10:00 AM – 5:00 PM.

ii. Development of Courses:

- The courses were developed by NCERT and no adaptations/translations were made in the content.
- New Batch IDs and Do_IDs for each course is generated by theState and uploaded to the state portal.

iii. Implementation of Strategy:

The courses were run using Model 1 – Online Registration and teachers do self- registration and carry out the online courses themselves.

iv. Communication System:

A dedicated telegram group, "NISHTHA on DIKSHA Chhattisgarh 2020" was created and all the enrolled were asked to join the same. The telegram group was utilized to disseminate official information. Doubts and problems faced were also addressed through the same telegram group.

WhatsApp groups were also created at different levels in order to share information and clarify doubts:

- State level group wherein Director, SCERT, State Project Director, Samagra Shiksha, State coordinators and Technical Coordinators share necessary information.
- NISHTHA on DIKSHA technical coordinators administered by DIKSHA technical team.
- District level groups administered by DEO's and DMC's, officials from Samagra Shiksha and officials from the SCERT.

- NISHTHA on DIKSHA group for Point of Contact members. Each course is assigned a POC in order to ensure success of the training programme.
- NISHTHA monitoring group for the state administered by state coordinators.
 Technical coordinators as well as technicians are present in this group and all necessary actions to be taken are easily shared through the group.

v. Monitoring and Reporting:

- The training programme was monitored at the state level by state coordinators and technical coordinators headed by the Director SCERT.
- Training data i.e., enrolment and completion data was requested through the DIKSHA App every Sunday night at 8:00-10:00 PM by technical team of SCERT.
- This weekly report generated through the DIKSHA App was submitted to the NCERT every Monday during the training programme.

vi. Any other aspects taken by the state:

For the success of the training programme, subject experts from the SCERT wereappointed to act as Point of Contact where one person was assigned a particular course.

- Names and contact details of the POC's were made available to the teachers through Telegram and WhatsApp groups to ensure that any queries from the trainees are immediately dealt with and clarified at theearliest by the experts. (See annexure i)
- WhatsApp group for the POC's was also created for sharing of information and clarification of doubts.

6. DATA ANALYSIS AND INTERPRETATION:

i. TARGET:

The target for NISHTHA through DIKSHA was ${\bf 1,34,599}$ Heads and Teachers.

7. ISSUES AND CHALLENGES

- 1. DIKSHA App needs to be more open across platforms.
- 2. Poor Connectivity Videos were not able to load properly in the DIKSHA app.
- 3. Many teachers have problems in keeping up with the growing trend intechnology and need to be assisted through phone calls.
- 4. Certificates were generated intermittently. While some were not gettinggenerated, others were generated multiple times.

8. KEY LEARNINGS

- Awareness and development of skills on aspects relating to Learning Outcomes, Competency Based Learning and Testing, Learner - centered Pedagogy, School Safety and Security etc.
- Awareness of the provisions regarding Gender, The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.
- Alertness and responsiveness to the needs of students, in addition to promoting joyful learning and taking special care of the requirements of special children.
- Awareness of Covid-19 scenario in schools addressing challenges in school education.

9. SUGGESTIONS

Even though the training programme is well planned in terms of content and pedagogy, there is evidently a problem in technical aspects. It is suggested that:

- Formal registration with all required user data may be made mandatory at the time of
 initial registration so as to avoid requirement to edit user data at a later time which
 could be burdensome for someusers.
- Availability of data for each particular state without the need for requesting, which resulted in delay in reporting.
- Optimized platform so that trainees with poor internet connection may be able to work on the App efficiently.
- Problems in generating certificates must be avoided.

10. CONCLUSION

NISHTHA on DIKSHA was completed successfully for Elementary level heads and teachers. The state is looking forward to the next level of NISHTHA 2.0 and 3.0 for Secondary School teachers and Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN). These courses are expected to fulfil the need for continuous professional development of teachers in the absence of physical interaction due to the pandemic.
