GUJARAT report of

NISHTHA 1.0 (Elementary Level)

1. Introduction

The NISHTHA (National Initiative for School Heads' and Teachers' Holistic Advancement) training has been started by MoE, Gol to ensure equal opportunity to all teachers across the country. In Gujarat, GCERT as the nodal agency for training, has organized the NISHTHA training during year 2019-20 and 2020-21. Total 89297 teachers and 1555 KRPs-SRPs were training during year 2019-20. This training was offline and face to face in nature.

Due to COVID pandemic during year 2020-21, the NISHTHA training was organized through DIKSHA platform in online mode. Total 1,06,029 teachers were covered during the year through three phases. Thus total 1,88,615 teachers have been covered under NISHTHA training.

 - GCERT translated the all 17 module during 2019-20 and 18 course modules were translated during 2020-21 in Gujarati language.


• Implementation strategy

 - Email, WhatsApp & DIKSHA Platform


- Monitoring and reporting system:








Gujarat - Course Wise Total Enrolment data




Course Wise Completion data

Course Wise Certificate Issued data




Course Wise Enrolment, Completion and certification data (in percentage)






